Report – Virasat 2023





- 1. The heritage collective of BMCC organizes Virasat every year, and since its beginning, the event never fails to stand out with its originality by celebrating culture in an innovative and authentic style. The event was held on 27th of December between 10am to 12pm where the hall was filled with a genuine and sincere crowd. He was studying to become a chartered accountant when he was a student of BMCC, where he found out about Pittie hall where students can explore the cultural and artistic parts of themselves. He told us



about his maiden venture, a play called *Cycle* where he directed Mr. Amey Wagh, one of his closest friend, an actor and a BMCC alumni. He further talked about his decision of leaving his article ship and pursuing writing and directing as a full-time career after his graduation. He started a theatre troupe called Natak Company along with various other students of BMCC and worked on the revival of sangeet-natak. After few years of working in theatre he started to feature in a few Marathi films and made his debut as a director through

his film Baapjanma in the Marathi film industry. He talked about his latest release Me Vasantrao, about how the idea first came into existence in around 2011 where he first got to know about Vasantrao Deshpande and how he got inspired by his work and life, and to then properly researching and finding a story that will be a biopic but also a story that would engage with the audience, and how it all came to fruitation when it released in 2022. He shared all of this while giving little anecdotes here and there, making the audience laugh and keeping a light-hearted atmosphere.

4. The event proceeded with questions right from the audience. Mr. Nipun engaged with the audience by attentively addressing their inquiries. When asked about his YouTube talk show *Casting Couch*, he

humbly gave all the credit to Mr. Sarang Sathey as it was his idea, and to Mr Amey Wagh for its popularity. One of our student asked what made him leave his article ship and seriously pursue writing to which he gave a beautiful response that with discipline you can achieve whatever you are currently striving for, while working in the company he could see that he could very well become a CA but he did not have that confidence that he would

His answers told us that he is more interested in telling a story rather than the commercial success it makes, mentioning his recent visit to Hampi, he told us that there are thousands of stories to be told just from that small city that has years of heritage and cultural references

dwelling inside it, saying he would love to make such a story and help it reach towards the audience. His knowledgeable and engaging manner captivated the audience, making the interaction an enriching experience for all involved.
